





Q5 During this boating season, how often have you, or your guests, had a need to park your/their car(s) on YOUR street and had trouble finding a spot?





Q7 Do you consider parking on your STREET a problem?



Q8 Do you consider parking in your NEIGHBORHOOD a problem?





23	I've already made extensive comments as a boatowner on that survey. Basically Town Landing road is almost totally no-parking because the neighborhood fought for it. It needs to remain no-parking. Almost all of Foreside Road is supposed to be no-parking. The small areas where it is allowed either are or should become time limited. But it needs to be enforced better than it currently is. I personally think that Mariner Lane should be no-parking but it is not a big issue with me. I was in favor of the 260 Foreside property being made into a parking lot when it was first purchased. I participated in a resident forum and was in the minority so it did not happen. I still believe that Town Landing is overburdened and we need more parking to support the moorings that are accessed from there.
