Erin will try to have mugs to sell at the polls on June 13. She will look into the grocery bags. She will also send out a sign-up sheet for volunteers for the fair and the polls.

5. Other Outreach

Joel reported that the City of Portland is hosting a Senior Carnival called SMASH! in Payson Park on August 27 from 10-2. It is an old-time carnival and there is no charge to participate. The committee could hand out flyers, etc. The committee expressed interest in participating and will plan later.

Erin and Carol met with the churches today and they seemed interested. Some ideas were for an ecumenical service on Memorial Day weekend, a joint chorus, and a Day of Service. They asked the churches to promote the tercentennial in their newsletters, host the travelling display and also host events. They were interested in the grants, but concerned with the turnaround time. Erin said the committee could extend the deadline or reopen the grant application in September.

Erin met with Town Department heads; all the town vehicles will have the tercentennial log on them. She will get quotes for car-size decals as giveaways. The town will also have letterhead with the logo. Community Programs has it on their invoices already and will use it on all camp t-shirts this summer.

Erin is meeting with Alex, who may be able to bring tall ships to Falmouth. On June 2, she is presenting a brief history of Falmouth at Oceanview.

Jeanne and Erin met with Maine Audubon, REAC, FCC, and the Falmouth Land Trust about the lecture series. They are looking at a historical lecture with a specific focus on geography, ecology, the environment and how this impacted Falmouth's history. The group will meet again the end of this month. There is a lot of excitement.
