• Falmouth Land Trust request for Volunteers

Erin said the Land Trust is doing a lecture series event down at Underwood Park in June. They are looking for more volunteers in general, and for that event and for Old Home Days.

Marge had an idea for honoring veterans of the colonial wars and Fort New Casco by decorating the monument and having a table at the reception after the Memorial Day parade. The committee supported the idea. Marge will prepare a write up, and Erin and Melissa will put it into booklet form to print up for the table.

Erin and Joel have been discussing Incorporation Day and having the "Oceanview Chorus" perform. She said planning will start for that event in June.

The committee drew a winner for the April Move300 drawing.
