#### **3. Alumni Picnic & Street Dance**

Erin has followed up with the food trucks; she has three confirmed. The Farmers' Market people and a DJ will be there. The Police will block off some streets before the fireworks start at 8:30. Erin notified the Library and the Legion and will call the movie theater again. She has Sheri, Ellen, Carol, and Bill scheduled to run the store. It should be set up around 5pm. Kimberly Darling will do the recycling station. Erin decided against having the exhibit set up.

#### **4. Waterfront Bash**

Erin asked about setting up the store at this event. The committee decided to have the store and Ellen and Jeannie offered to run it. Erin asked how to get tables and how to get them down there. She will ask Lt. Kilbride. There is another planning meeting with the harbormaster and the Lt. scheduled for August 15. Erin showed a mock-up of the interpretive panel; it may not be ready before the event. Ellen suggested having a mock-up to have at the event in case the panel isn't ready.

Carol wondered about having a minister do an invocation; Erin will speak with Nathan. The committee discussed roles for the dignitaries; Carol suggested a receiving line. The committee discussed who to ask to speak; Marge would like someone who is a life-long resident to speak from the heart.

#### **6. Calendar Project**

Ellen said she has two new sponsors for the calendar: Camden National Bank and Drummond Woodsum. This is all the sponsors they need for the project. They are meeting with the designer and plan to have the calendar ready to mail mid-December. Each of the sponsors will get copies to give out as well.

This might draw more people to the event. Erin said the music departments have been great and been involved, and they are doing a play.
