REAC Minutes January 9, 2020

Afton presented an overview of lighting in general. The presentation included an analysis of the streetlights as well as the interior lighting upgrades.

The streetlight project's annual savings are approximately \$75,000 with a 5.8 year payback.

The interior lighting project's annual savings weren't as straight forward as the streetlights due to the nature of the lighting; moreover, there were a variety of different types of lighting needs. There were outliers in the data from 2018 to 2019 in the summer months at the public works and fire department. The loss in savings from the lighting upgrades in power is likely due to the increase in electrical use attributing to increases in a demand for air conditioning.

Kimberly is going to send the presentation to the group. Dave has also requested to see if EMC has energy data on the fixtures themselves; Pete also thinks it would be good for the newsletter.

• Plastic Straw Ban Proposal update

Donna reported that she spoke with Cathy Breen, who reported that the State does not have any laws on the table for banning plastic straws state wide. The majority of businesses have already implemented request only policies if they haven't changed over to the alternatives yet. Kimberly and Donna are presenting this information to the Town Council's ordinance committee on January 16.

REAC voted to recommend to the Town council a ban on plastic straws January 1, 2021.
