## **Departmental Structure and Operations**

The Public Works Department's administrative staff consists of the following:

Jay Reynolds, Public Works Director Ryann Philbrook, Administrative Assistant Jamie Mason, Town Engineer Jeff Buxton, Street Superintendent

The Public Works Department consists of the following divisions:

- Streets and Right-of-Ways
- Solid Waste and Recycling
- Vehicle Maintenance

The Public Works Division maintains approximately 90 miles of roads and right-of-ways. Responsibilities include:

- Street Maintenance, including: plowing, paving, sweeping, line painting, roadside mowing, signage, etc.
- Drainage system operations and maintenance
- Engineering Services for Town departments
- Development Review and Inspection

The Solid Waste Division manages the following:

- Trash and Recycling Collections
- Transfer Station operations

The Vehicle Maintenance staff performs state inspections, repairs, and preventative maintenance.

## Departmental Work Includes:

- \* Capital improvement projects (paving, reconstruction, bike/ped., parks, etc.)
- Development review of planning board projects
- ❖ Stormwater management (DEP permitting and compliance, ISWG member)
- ❖ PACTS technical committee chair/DOT and MTA coordination
- ❖ Asset/Infrastructure Management (roads, sidewalks, and storm drain system)

## **2014 Projects in Falmouth**

- 1. Blackstrap Road Rehabilitation: The project area is between Hamlin Road and Hardy Road. The project began in June and will be completed in September.
- 2. Route 1 Infrastructure Project: The Construction phase of Route 1 between Bucknam Road and Route 88. The pavement resurfacing of the project area will complete the project in the summer of 2015.
- 3. Hurricane Road Rehabilitation: Roadway and Drainage upgrades with complete pavement resurfacing. Project is currently under construction and will be completed in September.
- 4. Annual Paving: This year's annual paving list consists of the following roads:
  - a. Leighton Road (Brook to Gray Rd.)
  - b. Middle Road (Bucknam Road to Turnpike Overpass)
  - c. Woods Road (Woodlands Drive to Woodville Road)
- 5. Maine Turnpike Authority and MDOT:
  - a. Rehabilitating the Turnpike overpass on Falmouth Road (near Woodville Road).
  - b. MDOT: Repaying Leighton Road between Gray Road and Falmouth Road. This is a PACTS project, which receives 75% federal and state funding.
  - c. MDOT survey and design for intersection changes (roundabout) at Longwoods Road and Woods Road.
  - d. MDOT: Signal Warrant Analysis at I-295 North ramps and Bucknam Road intersection.
- 6. Natural Gas Expansion: Summit Natural Gas pipeline expansion in Yarmouth, Cumberland, and Falmouth. Work to begin in Falmouth in September of this year.
