Hi Justin,

This will follow-up on one component of our application – the eyebrow.

Nathan called October 28 indicating that he had been asked by several counselors to review with the Town's plowing supervisor how the pending applications for street acceptance would impact plowing.

Continuing, Nathan conveyed that the Seaside Way eyebrow would be a November 9 agenda item as a definitive Council straw poll had not been taken on this aspect.

Having listened to the entire October 26 Town Council meeting, this was surprising.

In response to my follow-up, Nathan advised that if there is anything we wanted the Council to consider, we should get this to you today.

Please accept this submission as our best effort at anticipating unframed issues.

First, counselors did ask about pavement width. This will flesh out our response.

The **attached measurements and aerial plot** confirm that at a uniform 22 feet, Seaside Way integrates with and exceeds (at the points measured) adjacent connectors Amerescoggin and Underwood /Glen.

Second, counselors have asked for input on plowing.

We understand staff is in the process of preparing a memo confirming DPW input that Seaside would fit in the existing area route which uses small equipment to navigate Glen Road and the Amerescoggin and Glen turnarounds.

Each is a challenge. See attached 2 turnaround area photos for Amerescoggin and Glen, respectively.

By contrast, the entry and exit of the Seaside eyebrow is equivalent to the Amerescoggin turnaround and greatly exceeds the Glen turnaround.

Yet plowing Seaside doesn't require a turnaround. Our eyebrow forms a continuous loop.

A circle which, as noted at the October 26 meeting, is used by walkers and young children on bicycles looking for level pavement, off Route 88, with no traffic.

Third, the eyebrow is an integral and scaled component of the road. See attached **Seaside Way eyebrow photo**.

Contrast this with the attached **Stonecrest Road eyebrow photo.** We understand Stonecrest, a one-way, is the only example in which an eyebrow was severed as part of a town road acceptance.

Our preference is unchanged – the entire 550 foot road be accepted so it serves all eight, not just six, of our denselysited existing neighborhood infilling homes.
