Public Survey & Forum

Survey Results

- 84 respondents
- 41 said it was "very important" to mark the 300th
- 32 said it was "fairly important" or "important"
- 4 said it was "not at all important"
 - Objections based upon cost
- Majority saw learning about Falmouth's history and having a fun celebration as most important goals
- Historic preservation, historical tours and a fair or festival were the top choices for ways to mark the 300th.

General Themes

- Focuses on education
- Year-long offering of activities
- Inspires involvement from all sectors of the Falmouth community
- Has economic impact
- Highlights our history and heritage
- Celebrates the natural attributes of our community with lots of outdoor activities
- Expands on existing events

Goals

Honor the Past, Celebrate the Present, Invest in the Future

Honor the Past

- Honor the town's founders and those who contributed to its history
- Tell the story of Falmouth's history through personal stories
- Create a multi-media history project as a legacy of historical scholarship

Celebrate the Present

- Showcase the many cultural, recreational, and natural resources Falmouth offers
- Foster community spirit and civic pride
- Highlight that Falmouth is a giving community
- Create multi-generational activities for fun and community building

Invest in the Future

- Create events to attract outside visitors for increased economic impact
- Shine a spotlight on Falmouth to encourage residents & visitors to choose Falmouth when considering leisure, business or commercial pursuits

Amend and extend the charge of the Committee through December 2018 so that it might carry out the following recommendations.

Serve as the umbrella organization under which a larger town-wide, year long, commemoration of Falmouth300 is organized, promoted, and marketed by maintaining a part-time Tercentennial Coordinator who will assist the Committee with its organization and implementation.

- Host a web and social media presence
- Develop a logo and branding
- Market and promote all commemorative events
- Facilitate partnerships between the town, schools, businesses, organizations and community groups to develop activities

Create a collaborative history of Falmouth project.

- Digitizing current oral histories held by Falmouth Historical Society
- Town-wide Oral/Video History Project in partnership with Falmouth Memorial Library, Falmouth Historical Society, Falmouth Schools and the town's senior community
- Published history of Falmouth
- Travelling exhibit documenting the town's history
- Self-guided historical tour of Falmouth

Organize 5-7 commemorative events or activities.

- Community Celebrations
 - Kick-Off Event
 - Multi-Day Event (Old Home Days)
 - Closing Event
- Economic Impact Events to bring visitors into Falmouth. The Committee suggests:
 - Triathlon or Road Race
 - Taste of Falmouth /Wine or Beer Tasting Festival
- Falmouth300 Challenges
- Grant Program

Costs & Funding

Estimated Costs: \$282,000

- Potential Fundraising: \$90,000
 - Sale of Food and Merchandise
 - Sponsorship
 - Admission Fees/Ticket
 Sales/Registration Fees
 - Grants
 - In-Kind Donations

- Town Support: \$192,000
 - Town TIF Development Plans
