ELECTRIC LAWNCARE

We know that the greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions from driving our cars are harmful to the environment, but have you thought about the impacts that using two-cycle engines, like chainsaws and leaf blowers, can have on the environment? Particulate matter which is emitted by cars and two-cycle engines a like, can be very harmful to human health and can increase the risk of cancer in individuals. Studies show that two-cycle engines are responsible for the highest percentage of the particulate matter measured in our atmosphere.

Don't worry, we have a solution for you, more and more companies are making electric versions of the tools we often use to take care of our yards and cut firewood.

Investing in e-tools for your lawncare needs comes with many benefits including, quieter equipment, easier maintenance, and they are lighter. Additionally, these efforts will help the Town and the State-wide effort to reduce GHG emissions.




NO IDLING SIGNS ARE AVAILABLE
